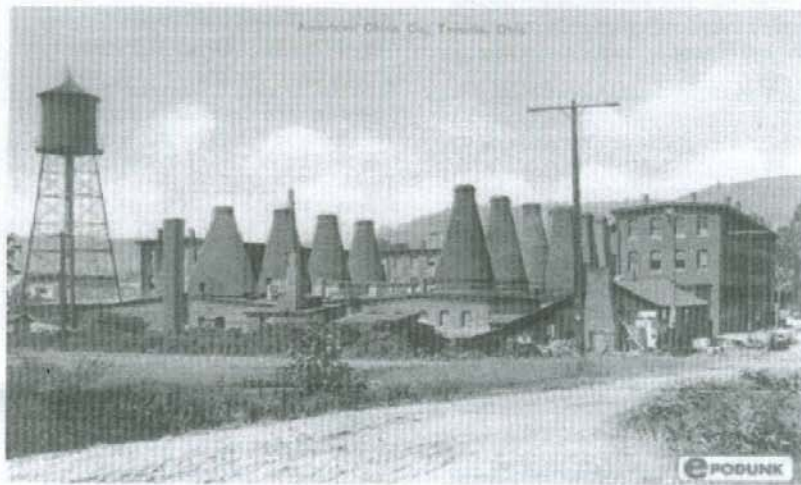

**The American China Company** was the first company in the United States to produce the type of china known as "Whiteware Pottery". This factory was located on the south corner of Loretta and Fourth Streets, along the railroad tracks. The location later became the Toronto Paper Mill and today is known as Valley Converting, a leading recycler of paper products, owned by the Biasi family. It was started by a group of local financiers in the late 1800's, headed by millionaire contractor, builder and capitalist, Edward J. M'Ilvain, who became the first President of the company. The plant was one of the first in the country to be illuminated in its entirety by the as yet unproved electric lights. The leading employer in Toronto prior to 1900, it ceased operations in 1910. It employed many women who worked decorating the ware, placing gold bands on the plates and saucers with great skill, speed and accuracy.



The ware had a distinctive coloration, which by today's parlance might be designated as being slightly off white. In addition to the dinnerware, the company manufactured an extensive line of novelties, fine jardinières, and made a specialty of souvenir goods. The souvenirs of the Elks Convention held in Allegheny in 1899 and also over 1000 superb loving cups were made for the Knight's Templar Conclave which convened in Pittsburgh in 1898.



The plate at the left is an example of the decorative pottery produced by the company. This plate was previously owned by Miss Ada Maxwell, who many of you will fondly remember as a teacher and Principal in the Toronto School system.

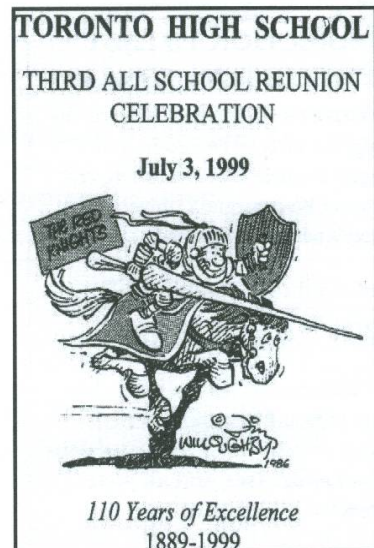

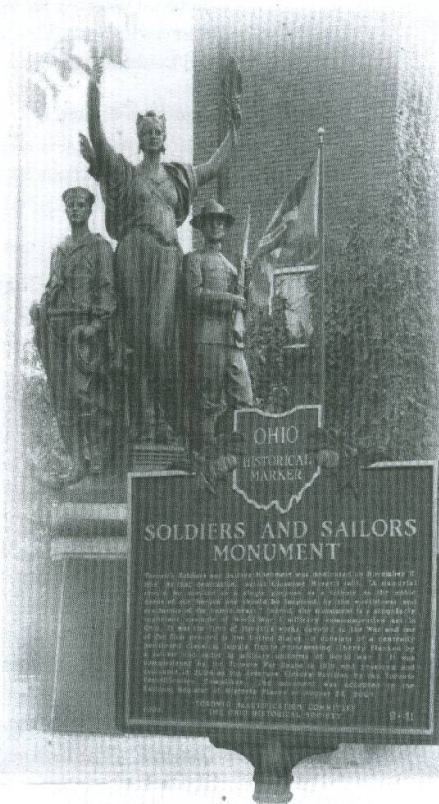

## **SOLDIERS & SAILORS MONUMENT**



The Ohio Historical Society has placed the city's monument to WWI and the surrounding pavilion on its registry of historic sites in the state. The two-sided bronze plaque, placed at the site by the state historical society, tells the story of how one of the nation's first monuments to WWI came into being. The monument was commissioned by a coalition of city citizens and business owners at the end of WWI and was created by then world-renowned sculptor Giuseppe Moretti. The bronze tablets on the monument contain the names of 300 soldiers, sailors and marines, including one woman. It also bears eleven gold stars for the eleven men and one woman who gave the supreme sacrifice for our freedom during the "great war". Two of those killed were Paul and Ray McLean, sons of James McLean, a Toronto teacher. It was their sister, Frances, on the afternoon of Nov. 11, 1919, with a crowd in the tens of thousands, who pulled the cord that unveiled the statue for the first time. The pavilion surrounding the monument has become a gathering place for city citizens during holidays dedicated to veterans and times of war or national calamity.

In 2003, the city's beautification committee began a project that renovated the pavilion and the statue was refurbished and cleaned. A program and dedication of the historical marker was held on October 28, 2006.
